BARANGAY PEACEKEEPING and ACTION TEAM and BASIC LIFE SUPPORT TRAINING.

Results/Action taken:

The training on Basic Life Support was sponsored by the Philippine National Police of Sabangan through Chief of Police Soliven and Gaspar Tafaleng. The PNP requested the Provincial Health Emergency Response Team or ER 26 of Mountain Province to be the training facilitator for the Basic Life Support of Barangay Pingad. The ER 26 secretariat forwarded text to all available ER 26 members as a lecturer and trainer on August 1-2, 2014 which I only joined on the second day that is Saturday.

On August 1, 2014 the PNP started the activity on police matters and followed by demonstration on how to use elastic and triangular bandage on trauma patient and burns by EMT Sir Ador Tacut and followed by return demonstration of participants.

On August 2, 2014 we were fetched by the PNP Police Car of Sabangan and the lecture and demonstration started on Module 1 (Principle of Emergency Care), Module 3 (Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation) and Module 4 (Foreign Body Airway Management) which was finished at exactly 12:39 noon. After lunch, that is exactly 1:15pm we started with the return demonstration of participants. The ER 26 "DAGEM" batch of EMT also performed how to do splinting, packing and transfer of patient.

At about 6:39 pm the most awaited part of the program was giving of impression by participants per group and followed by message of the COP Soliven, the DRRMO of Sabangan and by Mayor Danglose of Sabangan. The participants expressed their thanks and appreciation to the training. HOME SWEET HOME to Bontoc.
