II. Rationale

Due to the COVID 19 pandemic, the government restricted face to face teaching and learning inside the classroom this coming school year 2020-2021 until a vaccine for this pandemic will be developed. With this, the Department of Education adopted the blended learning strategy. Distance learning or modular learning is one of the teaching and learning strategies adopted by Dep-Ed under the blended learning to be implemented this school year 2020-2021.

The Vicariate Schools of Mountain Province (VSMP), partner schools of MPSPC in its extension services is one of the private schools in the province who adopted the modular teaching-learning strategy. While modular teaching is being adopted, the VSMP wants to explore other teaching and learning strategies that would complement their modular mode of instruction to maximize learning. Thus, they decided to make and use instructional videos. However, with their limited knowledge and skills on developing and editing instructional videos and cognizant to the benefits and effects of instructional videos in the advancement of knowledge of the students, they requested the college to share their expertise on this topic. These instructional videos can be uploaded or send through website and social media and can be downloaded by students who have access to internet. However, those students who cannot access the internet may ask their parents to get a softcopy of the instructional video from the school that they can watch it in their TV sets.

Being the partner schools of the college in its extension services, the Teacher Education Department (TED) together with the Information Technology

spearhead the conduct of this training (Development of Instructional Videos) on September 10-12, 2020 at the MPSPC Admin Function Hall and IT laboratory rooms.

III. OBJECTIVES

- 1. To increase the level of knowledge of the teachers on the development of instructional videos.
- 2. To develop instructional videos.

IV. EXPECTED OUTPUT

- 1.Increased level of knowledge of the teachers on the development of instructional videos.
- 2. Developed instructional videos.

V. METHODOLOGY

This training will adopt the lecture and hands-on (workshop) methodology. On the morning of the 1st day will be the lecture on the theoretical considerations on instructional videos in the educational settings. It also includes lectures on the integration of ICT in the teaching and learning process.

The opening program and lectures will be conducted in the Administration Building Function Hall.

Immediately after the lectures, the participants will proceed to the IT laboratory rooms for the introduction of the software to be used in developing instructional videos.

The 2nd day and morning of 3rd day will focus on workshops. The participants will develop instructional videos on selected topics of their choice. On the afternoon of the workshop will be presentation of their outputs to be critiqued by selected panel from the college. After the presentation will be the closing program and planning for the next activity

Compliance to Health Protocols

Participants together with the facilitators and coordinators are required to wear their face masks and face shields. Alcohol or hand sanitizers at the doors will be available for hand sanitation.

II. NARRATIVE REPORT

The Vicariate Schools of Mountain Province (VSMP), partner schools of MPSPC in its extension services is one of the private schools in the province who adopted the modular teaching-learning strategy this SY 2020-2021 due to COVID 19 pandemic. Thus, the VSMP requested the college to share their expertise on developing instructional videos. The Teacher Education Department (TED) together with the Information Technology (IT) Department acted on their request thus the training was implemented with the following objectives:

- i. to increase the level of knowledge of the VSMP teachers on the development of instructional videos; and
- to develop instructional videos.

The 3-day training on Instructional Videos was graced by the message of Dr. Rexton F. Chakas, College President and Rev. Fr. Allen Basillio, Schools Director, VSMP. Dr. Chakas said that this COVID 19 pandemic is not at all bad. It has made us realize the full potential and boundless possibilities of using educational technology to support the learning at home. On the other hand, Rev. Fr. Allen Basillio, emphasized Educational Leadership - how educators should act on this particular situation. This was followed by the overview of the activity presented by Dr. Mark Lopez, TED Chairperson.

Training proper followed with the following topics:

a. Theoretical Consideration on Instructional Designs lectured by Dr. Susan Lopez;

Chuwaley Taguba; and

c. Power Director Applications lectured by Miss Chuwaley Taguba.

Workshop at the Computer Laboratory was facilitated by the IT facultymembers together with the MIS Unit staff.

Panel members during the presentation and critiquing of outputs at the Admin Conference Hall were Dr. Mark Preston Lopez, Dr. Susan Lopez, Dr. Rhoda Galangco, Ms. Derine Aguid, Mr. Jerico Limog, and Dr. Annie Grail Ekid. The order of presentation:

After the presentation, the following are the general comments of the panel members:

1. Perspective of Instruction

Dr. Mark Lopez emphasized on the importance of the appeal to the emotions of learners; didactics - what learners want to learn in the heart and mind; too much enthusiasm and no enthusiasm; voice consistency; delivery; and loyal to the script (no adlib).

Dr. Rhoda Galangco stressed the significance of setting the psychological mindset of learners; maintaining connection – eye contact, move around; presenting self in a presentable manner (wear uniform); asking questions in between; providing adequate examples to validate experiences of learners; avoid giving wrong information; don't say thank you for watching – it is the responsibility of the learner to watch; addressing learners with special needs; be gender sensitive; don't advertise yourself – focus on the lesson; and letting your lesson flow naturally.

2. Technical Aspect

Dr. Susan Lopez highlighted on the readability; capitalization; use of color; importance of pausing; relating new lesson to the past lesson; using proper background; and volume and clarity of inserted videos.

Ma'am Derine Aguid gave emphasis to matching videos inserted to the subject matter presented. Mr. Jericho Limog commended the participants that they are now ready for *Advance Knowledge on Instructional Videos*.

Dr. Annie Grail Ekid and Miss Derine Aguid provided the prize given to selected presenters chosen by the panel members. They are the following:




The 3-day training ended successfully.








Awarding of prizes for the best instructional videos during the closing program


