H. INTRODUCTION

A. Rationale:

Security, implies a stable, relatively predictable environment in which an individual or group may pursue its end without disruption or harm, and without fear of such disturbance and injury (Dulipas and Peckley, 2008).

In Bontoc, Mountain Province, the Provincial Security Guards are doing all ways and means to secure and protect the properties of the provincial government and the interests of their clients. However, their jobs also require paper works of which all events observed must be reported.

However, it was found out in the study of Mr. Dario F. Guinayen titled "The Security Operations of Provincial Guards in Mountain Province" that the first problem being encountered by the said Provincial Guards is Lack of training on report writing. Thus, this activity design is being proposed by the Criminology Department with the main goal of guiding the Provincial Guards on report writing through seminar-workshops.

Security education and fundamentals of gun safety with combat shooting are also included in this activity with the purpose of giving updates to security guards which will be helpful in their field of profession.

B. General Situations

Report writing is very important because it contains facts that tell a story on what transpired in a given place at a given time. It is a skill that can be polished and perfected. However, not all Provincial Security Guards know the sequence of writing a report though they have been writing in their log books. It can be understood that the Provincial Security Guards are not all college graduates, thus, they need to refresh their minds on the mechanics of report writing so that they can appreciate the concept of writing a report and its importance to the government and the public.

They must also be made aware of the up to date issues and concerns regarding security guards here in the Philippines and be reminded of the basic gun safety measures and to refresh their marksmanship skills.

C. Objectives:

1. Inform the participants on the different programs of the college as well as the VMGO of the institution;

- 2. Introduce the fundamentals of Technical Report Writing;
- 3. Instill the importance of Technical Report Writing;
- 4. Construct simple and short sentences;
- 5. To decipher the characteristics of paragraph and the impact of misspelled words in report writing;
- 6. Identify the different kinds and uses of punctuations;
- 7. Give emphasis on the use of past tense in writing investigation reports;
- 8. Discuss the guiding tools in writing a technical report;
- 9. Identify the classification, criteria, parts and format of reports;
- 10. Identify and differentiate the various written communications prepared and used by the Provincial Security Guards.
- 11. Identify and discuss the different types of security.
- 12. Enumerate and discuss the basic functions of security guards.
- 13. Discuss the basic security assessment and security plans.
- 14. Give emphasis on the importance of gun safety.
- 15. Adopt the basic rules of gun safety.

D. Significance of the Extension Activity

This activity or training is very important especially for the participants. This is for them to develop and increase self-confidence in their work. It also provide them an avenue of viewing the importance of report writing in a more positive perspective since the reports they make reflect their performance while on tour of duty.
