#### **Executive Summary**

## ADVOCACY ON ANTI-VIOLENCE AGAINST WOMEN AND CHILDREN & TRAINING NEEDS ASSESSMENT

As a gesture of support to the national government's thrust of increasing awareness on violence against women and children, the Mountain Province State Polytechnic College conducted a seminar on anti-violence against women and children in Barangay Betwagan, Betwagan Elementary School, Sangey National High School, Belwang National High School and Barangay Anabel, all in Sadanga, Mountain Province. This activity is a five – day series of advocacy on anti-VAWC which had commenced last December 5, 2014. Said activity was a very timely undertaking in as much as all the different places in the country are observing the 18 – day campaign to end violence against women.

The aim of the seminar was to increase awareness on the part of the community and the children on violence against women and children and how to stop and eliminate this. Participants to the said seminar were the community people, elementary pupils and high school students in the identified areas. This is also in line with the program of the Extension Unit that supports legislations geared to community development and support to Gender and Development (GAD) and Good Governance.

Spearheading the activity were the following:

- Personnel from the MPSPC Extension Unit headed by Mr. Elmer D. Pakipac;
- From the MPSPC GAD Office headed by Ms. Ursula Dontogan, GAD Focal person;
- Some faculty members from the Criminology Department namely Rommel Fecha,
   Alban Fanao, Emerson Olod, and Dr. Gina Lacaben;
- From the IT Department, Dr. Susan A. Lopez;
- From the Teacher Education Department, Mr. Keith Jimson B. Mang-usan.

They shared insights and views and other pertinent information on violence against women and children including laws covering VAWC, common crimes committed against women and children, physical abuse and how to combat VAWC.

Hon. Albert C. Ayao-ao, Vice Mayor of Sadanga who was present during the seminar in Betwagan expressed his utmost gratitude to the MPSPC contingent for enduring the long trek towards their barangay just to bring in and share vital information on VAWC to the people of Betwagan most especially to their children. He was all the more thankful upon learning that Barangay Betwagan is the first recipient of the MPSPC EHELPING PROJECT which was launched in Poblacion, Sadanga last November 24, 2014.

The principals in the schools in Sadanga who were recipients of the said activity were very much grateful to MPSPC for the pupils and students' eyes were now opened to the realities of life especially to their rights.

On the other hand, vis-à-vis the advocacy on anti-VAWC is the conduct of the training needs assessment in the same places. This is to further identify the needs of the said barangays and schools for future conceptualization of other extension activities to be conducted in Sadanga.

**Note**: The activity was originally scheduled December 6, 9, 10, 12 and 13 but due to unforeseen equally important activity which requires the presence of most of the speakers and facilitators, there were changes in the said schedules. Thus, the five day activity was conducted on December 5, 9, 12, 16 and 17.












VPRDE Susan A. Lopez conducting Learning Styles Self-Assessment for Grade 8 students in Sadanga National High School





#### II. RATIONALE:

Mountain Province State Polytechnic is very keen and bent in achieving its desired aim of bringing its services to the community. Having strengthened and reinvigorated its partnership with the Municipality of Sadanga as its cooperating agency, the Extension Unit of the institution is now spearheading the conduct of advocacies in the said Barangay. One of this is the Advocacy on Violence Against Women and Children.

The Advocacy on Violence Against Women and Children is a very timely undertaking in as much as we are now observing the 18 - day campaign to end violence against women from November 25 - December 12, 2014. The conduct of this activity is in support to the policy on VAWC and in compliance to DILG Memorandum Circular No. 2014 - 134 encouraging all local government units and others concerned to commemorate the said campaign in their respective localities and initiate activities for synchronized efforts in line with reinforcing the theme "End VAW Now! It's Our Duty!"

The said campaign, which aims to increase awareness on Violence Against Women and take action to eliminate it, started since 2002 of which the Philippines has been joining in. In 2013, President Aquino signed Republic Act 10398, declaring November 25 as the National Consciousness Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women and Children. Said law mandates all government agencies, including the DILG, to organize, engage or participate in activities designed to raise public awareness on the problem of violence and elimination of all forms of violence against women and children.

In Mountain Province alone, it is a fact that there are already recorded incidents of violence against women and children as well as unrecorded ones—in the homes, in the streets, in work places, in business establishments, in schools and other private and public places. A lot of women and children are not aware of their rights thus, violence against them are being committed without their knowledge. Children are so vulnerable that even if they wanted to react to violations, most of them opt to keep silent and move on for they don't have any inkling on how to combat this. Men also have roles in advocacy such as this. Engaging men in such activity makes them sensitive and more aware of their great responsibility in addressing pressing problems such as this. Men should be around to learn a lot of things thereby preventing them from committing acts violates women's and children's rights. Communities need to have an important role in defining solutions to violence and providing support to victims. And men must be engaged in the process too, as agents of change standing alongside women to end violence.

Advocacy on violence against women and children then is a very significant and noble act for it is through this that women and children become empowered, become knowledgeable of their rights, responsibilities and duties, and be protected from all forms of acts that are deemed unlawful by human beings, by the society, by governing laws including that of the private individuals.

It is in these regards that aside from the observance of the National Consciousness Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women and Children, the Extension Unit of MPSPC conceptualized such an activity not only to reach out to their target clienteles in the Municipality of Sadanga to increase the awareness of all women and children therein on the various forms of VAWC, its causes, and responsibilities of laypersons in ending such plights and situations but also to comply with the DILG's Memorandum Circular.

#### III. OBJECTIVES:

- 1. To discuss to the communities/clienteles Republic Act No. 9262: An Act defining violence against women and their children, providing for protective measures for victims, prescribing penalties therefore, and for other purpose.
- 2. To make the target clienteles/communities become aware on all things regarding Violence Against Women and Children through information dissemination.
