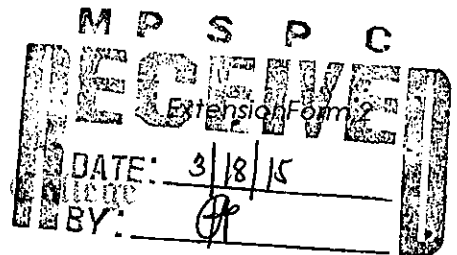

Executive Summary

It was a warm day of February 25, 2015, when the students of liberal Arts and two faculty members conducted an activity dubbed "Share a Gift" at Sitio Finnong, Betwagan, Sadanga, which was supposedly staged last December. Since every day is Christmas that means the expression sharing and caring for others, the LASO (Liberal Arts Student Organization) of MPSPC has to push through with this endeavor.

We packed school materials like pad papers, pencils and erasers, toys including slightly used clothes for the 100 expected number of day care pupils in Betwagan. At 8'oclock in the morning we traveled and trek to Betwagan since no road is accessible going to the barangay proper. Laden with the goods to be distributed, we have to cross two hanging bridges enduring the blistering heat and pain on our feet derived from walking about forty minutes, when finally, we had reached Finnong. Unexpectedly and surprisingly, we were welcomed by the kids, their parents, teachers, Barangay Officials; they had already prepared everything to be used. Our eyes were stunned by the lettering pasted in front, the letterings goes this way "WELCOME LIBERAL ARTS STUDENT ORGANIZATION, The warmth of giving is a means of experiencing love and care for others." Quoting one of the elder's statements, "this is one precise way of articulating our gratitude and appreciation from this opportunity instigated by the Liberal Arts students of MPSPC.

We rested a few minutes then we began with the program, the opening prayer was led by Elcarion Bumacas and the welcome remarks were given by Hon. Rodante Manolo. In the intermission part we students presented an animation or an action dance and then a solo rendered by Valorie Anne Khayad. Another message presented by Hon. Rafael Latayen, which he coherently praise the organization accompanied by the two faculty members for choosing their place as the venue for the said activity and elaborating further that even with that kind of climate we experienced, the desire to share gifts to the children urge us to trudge at these remote barangay. To break the boredom of the children, we also let them sang a song or dance in front. As a reward for them, we gave them pairs of slippers and some stuff toys.

All of them participated including their parents and teachers and us too, we also danced with them. To shorten the program we continued distributing gifts of school supplies together with their snacks. The closing remarks were given by our adviser Ma'am Geraldine Segseg acknowledging the cooperation of the teachers, parents, and barangay officials that made possible this activity success. The closing prayer was led by Kevin Cogan, and where he also serenaded us.

At lunchtime the parents of the day care pupils had prepared food for us shared by all those present during the event. As part of the customs and traditions long imparted to us, we in turn thank and recognized the concerted efforts of the teachers, parents and barangay officials.


As the quotation says, "It is in giving that we receive." We might get tired on our way and wanted to give up yet we still carried on, however, we will always remember the moment when we expressed our love for sharing and our care for those children who were so joyful when they received their presents and likewise to the community.

Problems Encountered, Actions Taken, and Recommendation:


1. Walking Distance
2. The hot weather.
3. Some students who are not used to walk or hike that kind of rocky pathway kept on complaining.
4. Some students also did not bring with them any protection from the sun.
5. Some of the students of Liberal Arts performed a song and an action dance.
6. The LASO distributed school supplies to the day care pupils.
7. Assisting the pupils in carrying their snacks as well as their gifts.

So, in this kind of activity ("Share a Gift"), the students should bring with them the things they necessarily need. They should always be prepared and ready too and help their co-members in organizing any activity that they will be conducting.

In connection may we please be given a copy of the list of children at the Day Care Center for our basis. Your approval and accommodation is very much appreciated.


