

Executive Summary

Preliminaries of the Activity:

Coordination to the different venue was done before the activity. Members of the climate change project together with the staff of Research-Development and Extension (RDE) travelled to the different municipalities to coordinate the said activity. The Activity has three parts mainly: (1) Presentation of result of the assessment on the vulnerability and adaptive capacity to climate change of rice based agro; (2) Validation and workshop on the climate change vulnerability assessment; and (3) Informal Education and distribution of flyers regarding the existence of climate change to the public.

Courtesy call was done before the start every start of the activity. The members of the climate change project and the RDE staff approached the Mayor's office of the different LGUs to seek for assistance, then proceed to the venue where the LGU identified.

Before the start of the activity, preliminary sessions were done in order to formalize the start of the activity and to introduce the activity to the participants. Likewise, the Mayor's of the different LGUs gave an opening and welcome remarks (most LGUs has a Mayors Representative to deliver the message) where they welcomed the speakers and the participants.

Activity Proper:

Presentation of Result of the Vulnerability and Adaptive Capacity to Climate Change of Rice-based Agro-ecosystems:

After the preliminary activities, Mr. Sean Camelon Ligligen discussed the results of the assessment of the vulnerability and adaptive capacity of rice based agroecosystems in Mountain Province in the different LGUs of the province. In the discussion, the results that were presented to the participants were the degrees of exposures of climates change hazards identified by the community, the biophysical and socio economics sensitivity to climate change, adaptive capacity and technological adaptation of the selected agricultural communities to climate change, and the vulnerability index and resilience of the agricultural communities to climate change.

After the presentation, the participants partook in the open forum. A glaring concern for the different municipalities was the extreme increase and occurrence of pest and diseases as an effect of climate change which came second to the increasing visits of typhoons in the province.

Validation and workshop regarding the climate change vulnerability for the last 3 years

After the presentation, RDE staff facilitated the workshop. The workshop aims to validate the information gathered and to update the hazards during the past 3 years (2014-2017. The participants identified the hazards, specifically the month and years where the hazards occurred and their specific damages. Likewise, the participants also identified their mitigation/interventions made for each of the hazards. Based from the workshop, most of the identified hazards are strong typhoons, hails storm and the huge increase and occurrence of pest and diseases.

Likewise, as a part of the Information and Education Campaign, flyers about Climate Change were also distributed to the participants in order to give them more information on the phenomenon. The MPSPC team also discussed some of the information presented in the flyers to clarify some of the misconceptions from the participants.

Also, some of the LGUs were requesting for the final manuscript of the research presented to serve as their base line data in making proposals for climate change.

Problems encountered, action taken and recommendation

Since it was observed that a huge increase of pests and diseases in the agroecosystems of the different municipalities is a glaring concern, it is recommended that:

- There should be a seminar workshop regarding pest and disease management in the concerned municipalities; and
- MPSPC should collaborate with the different LGUs of the province in addressing the issues and concern caused by climate change specifically the pest and disease.



II. RATIONALE:

Vulnerability and Adaptive Capacity to Climate Change of Rice Based Agro-ecosystem in Mountain Province were assessed. The project aims to know the exposure to climatic hazards, biophysical and socioeconomic sensitivity, adaptive capacity; vulnerability index and resilience to climate change hazards and to employ and enhance the adaptive capacity of farmers to climate change through S & T - Based farming system model.

The study used the VAST Agro tool developed by Garcia et.al. The tool is a rapid assessment tool which is community-based, focused on the

agriculture sector and views agriculture as a holistic system.

The vulnerability assessment was done through transect walk to observed the biophysical and socio-economic resources of the study sites. A focus group discussion was conducted using the climate change vulnerability and adaptive capacity assessment tool for the rice based agro-ecosystem supplemented by a survey questionnaire guide in the conduct of group interviews, ocular survey, observation and secondary data.

The result of project was analyzed and was presented in "Agency inhouse review". Some information was also created and integrated based on the perception and observation of the community. Thus, the team consolidated and summarized all the information, and created a flyer and

poster format of IEC materials.

One of the recommendations of the panel of evaluator during the agency in-house review was to disseminate the result to Local Government Unit (LGUs) for planning purposes and policy development when it comes to climate change risk.

Therefore, activity design was prepared to disseminate the result of the study


