Executive Summary

As the whole nation celebrates the 18-day campaign to end VAW/ VAWC, faculty members from the Criminology Department went to Betwagan National High School, Sadanga National High School, Betwagan Elementary School on November 28, December 6, 14-15, 2017 with the aim of conducting an advocacy against VAWC. Such activity coincided with the celebration of the Anti-VAWC worldwide.

In the Mountain Province, cases of violence against women and children are present but most of these are not recorded, others were not brought into the open and others were not known due to lack of information dissemination and knowledge updates, most especially to students who are in the different barangays of Mountain Province. Thus, MPSPC made it a point to conduct an advocacy on VAWC every now and then so that students will be more knowledgeable on VAWC, they will come to know what to do and whom to approach, and be more courageous enough to open up or report cases which are already considered as violence against women or children.

Participants were students and some teachers, and parents. Topics discussed were RA 9262, the different forms of VAWC zeroing in on physical violence, psychological and emotional violence, economic violence, and sexual violence. Child Abuse awareness were explained and presented. The roles and responsibilities of all people concerned were also

discussed most especially on “what to do, how to do it, where to go, whom to approach” in case one experience or have seen such violence against women and children were presented and discussed to the students.

Open forum ensued after all the discussions and presentations whereby the speakers were able to clearly answer the questions of the participants. The speakers reminded the students to always report any violations that they have seen so the perpetrators will be held liable, be punished and to avoid repetition of the same offense to the same victim or to other victims.

The teachers and the parents were very grateful to the institution for the knowledge and time they have shared to their students.

The information dissemination ended successfully with the distribution of IEC materials on VAWC.

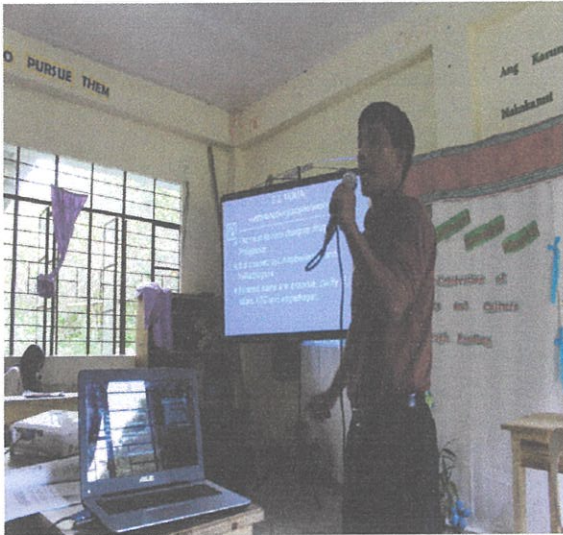
