#### TERMINAL REPORT

In compliance with the general provisions of the Magna Carta of Women (MCW), Mountain Province State Polytechnic College aspires to serve as a model of community and environment on GAD Mainstreaming through technology transfer and livelihood programs that incorporates the provision of financial literacy, technical assistance and other extension services (CMO#1 s. 2015)

The aim of the Training was to extend capacity building projects that shall enable the beneficiaries (Unemployed Mothers ) to earn through livelihood skills training in the transfer of financial knowledge, information, application and technology.

The first part of the training was conducted at the  $3^{\rm rd}$  floor Red Cross building. There were 4 participants, from the community, 3 from the academe and 3 Trainors. Trainors were from the Saint Luis Barangay Women's Organization, who cam and share their expertise on rug making.

The activity started with orientation, preparation of materials and on hand making of the foot rugs. Headed by Ms. Bernadette Chumangsiw of Baguio City the training and on hand rug making was successful. 1 deserving beneficiary, Mrs. Merlyn F. Baltazar was given a complete kit for rug making which consists of; molder/frame, Cloth, Scissors, hook and file "garugad". Finish products can be sold from 20.00 to 35 pesos each. Second batch of this training will be conducted on September 1-2, 2018.



#### RATIONALE

Commission on Higher Education (CHED) Memorandum Order No.1, Series of 2015. All Higher Education institutions shall; observe the provision, availability and accessibility of opportunities, services, and observance of human rights which enable women to actively participate and contribute to the political, economic, social, and cultural development of the nation as well as those which shall provide them equal access to ownership, management, and control of production, and of material and informational resources and benefits in the family, community, and society. (MCW) it is the process and condition by which women mobilize to understand, identify and overcome gender discrimination so as to achieve equality in welfare and equal to resources. In this context women become agents of development and not just beneficiaries, enabling them to make decisions based on their own views and perspective.

Under Part VII on Gender Responsive Extension Program, Rule III Livelihood program with financial literacy is one of the priority areas where capability building projects shall enable the beneficiaries, both women and men to earn through livelihood skills training including the transfer of financial knowledge, information and applications.

For this very reason the MPSPC GAD System together with the BSBA and BSA department conducts the aforementioned activity for qualified unemployed single mothers in the IP community as one way of addressing the poverty.

#### VII. Objectives

1. Create micro-enterprises of qualified individuals/groups to generate income and to generate livelihood to alleviate poverty in the countryside

2. Develop innovative partnerships and a sustainable organization for rug making.

### VIII. Beneficiaries and Impact

#### a. Beneficiaries

- The Unemployed Single Mother in the community and the Indigenous People (IPs) of Mountain Province.

### b. Expected Output

After the completion of the project, the following outputs shall be realized:

1. Complete training of at least 10 unemployed single mothers of Mountain Province in the production and Marketing Rugs;

2. Establishment of formal market system for rugs in the market and every municipality, within the area.

#### c.2 Economic Impact

The project helps to provide trainings that enhance the skills and Financial Literacy of IPs particularly the women sector in the community. It aims to empower women's IP that they don't have to go to the city for employment thus, maintaining their culture and traditions. It will also be an alternative source of income for the Women.

#### D. ACTION PLAN

a. Purchase and preparation of materials and other machineries will be done within a week before the training.

b. Production will be started arranging other inputs taking another week.
