II. NARRATIVE REPORT

The Gender and Development Office in partnership with the Criminology Department and in coordination with Barangay Samoki, concluded the Celebration of the 2021Women's Month through an extension seminar entitled, "Women in Leadership, Achieving an Equal Future in the Barangay in a COVID-19 World" on March 29-20, 2021 at the Casa Susana, Samoki, Bontoc, Mountain Province.

The activity was conducted to emphasize that women from all walks of life have in their own way shown leadership and compassion in the delivery of inclusive, innovative, and effective responses to the pandemic. The objectives of the activity were to inform and engage women of Barangay Samoki and make "change" work for them in this time of pandemic, and inspire and empower women and girls to be agents of change – to contribute in promoting gender equality and the empowerment of all women. The activity was originally scheduled on March 18-19, 2021. However, due to unforeseen circumstances such as the Campus Lockdown and imposed restrictions, the seminar was postponed and was finally conducted on March 29-30, 2021. 35 participants composed of Sangguniang Kabataan Officials, Barangay Officials, Barangay Midwife, Barangay Health Workers, Day Care Workers, representatives from Non-Government Organizations, and Samoki Youths attended the said activity.

For the first day of the seminar, Updates on Women Services in the Barangay Rural Health Unit was presented by Ms. Pascuala L. Fantiyao, the Barangay Midwife of Samoki. Ms. Dixty L. Caranto, the MPSPC Gender and Development Focal Person also lectured on Women Empowerment and Women in Leadership. In the afternoon, a Film viewing on Gender Issues, brainstorming, and sharing of points of view was conducted. On the second day, Dr. Claire Kaplaan Lafadchan, a faculty member from the Criminology Department lectured on Women's Rights. It was followed by the lecture on Policies and Laws for Women which was presented by Ms. Parline Angyap Ullalim, also a faculty member from the Criminology Department. In the afternoon, Mr. Anton Zaren Nasungan, the Sangguniang Kabataan Chairman gave updates on Women Empowerment in the Barangay. After the fruitful discussions and sharing, the participants were grouped for a workshop to craft plans which will be inculcated in

the GAD Plan of Barangay Samoki to address issues focused on women degradation and gender and development. Each group were able to present their plans. Inputs were given on the presented programs and line agencies were also recommended for tapping in order for these plans to be effectively implemented.

Before the seminar ended, Barangay Kagawad Victorina O. Awing thanked MPSPC and all the organizers and wished for more extension activities for the Barangay to have a broader knowledge on gender sensitivity matters.
